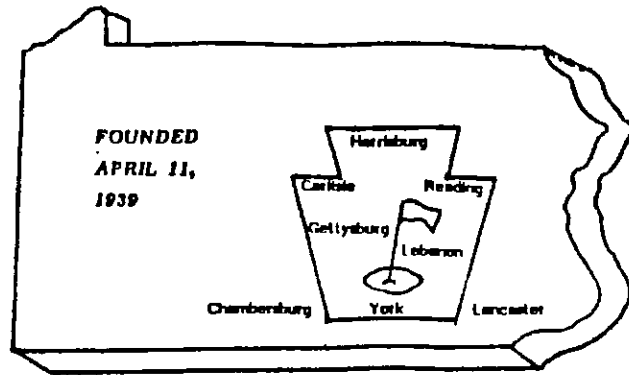

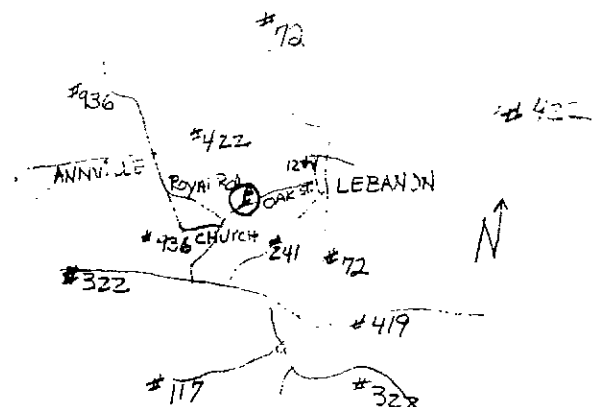

Research at Lebanon Country Club has determined that Mr. Alexander Findlay was the original designer of Lebanon C.C.(but not the builder) The course was opened in 1921 as a 9 hole course, which is currently the back nine holes. Several years later the front 9 holes were built. During the past recent years their has been much renovation to the front 9 holes to blend with the same design characteristics as the back. Lebanon C.C. is a typical example of a course built in the 1920's, with approx. 6500 yds, small tees and greens that average less than 4500 sq ft and a variety of wonderful old trees.

Prior to being a superintendent he was the assistant superintendent at Carlisle Country Club as well as being a grounds person. Jeff is a 1985 PSU Graduate from Turfgrass Management. PETES TURF TIPS.....Dr. Peter Landschoot, PSU Extension

Anthrachnose Basal Stem Rot- on poa annua greens, leaves turn yellow to orange to red, crown looks black under a hand lens. Don't spray fungicide. Treat with a light application of nitrogen.

Crabgrass Pre-emergent Applications. You are not too late! Frost will kill any germinated crabgrass from the early warm spell.

Black Turfgrass Ataenius adults have been observed in the Central Pa. area. If you see adults you will see grubs in May.
