This book, a collection of informative IPM research and articles, is priced at \$10 for GCSAA members and \$12 for non-members. The price includes postage and handling.





EDITOR'S NOTE - June 1990

June has arrived with all its splendor and the promise of excessive heat and humidity to follow. The stress produced by environmental factors is well known and widely accepted. We plan our cultivation, fertilization, mowing and watering practices, etc., around this fact of life.

One area of stress that we sometimes forget is the effect of stress from pesticides being applied to our turf.

Not the normally safe materials used in a prudent way, but the potential of inaccurate application equipment.

Nozzles are often the culprit. Wettable powders cause wear to these finely machined orfices to the point of destruction. The excellent original pattern is destroyed. This can cause excessive application of material to a limited area, resulting in stress to the turf. With some new materials being used at ounces per acre, the stress factor can go off the scale.

Overlap is another concern. Using small amounts of materials doesn't provide a sharp contrast from sprayed to unsprayed areas. Adouble overlap with a worn out nozzle could produce a 4 times, or higher, rate of application. Stress results. Spray dye, foam markers, chain-drags on boom ends, etc., all help reduce this possibility.

In closing, stop to consider the stress produced by inaccurate spray applications. Soon July and August weather will provide more stress than any of us want.

DIRECTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

When I first debated about what I wanted to do the rest of my life, I considered the profession of a Golf Course Superintendent to be a good all-around career. I figured I would be out in the sun, play a little golf from time to time, and basically be my own boss. But as each year goes by I realize more about this profession I chose. A Golf Course Superintendent is not a profession, it's many professions. With my limited experience this is what I have accessed so far. We're Agronomists, Farmers, Forecasters, Diplomats, Politicians, Chemical Engineers, Mechanical Engineers, Plumbing Engineers, Electrical Engineers, Accountants, Doctors, Lab Technicians, Pathologists, Pharmacists, Businessmen, Yes-Men, No-Men, Defense Attorneys, Psychologists, Meteorologists, etc. (add a few of your own to the list). We all must have a high degree of patience. Sometimes I think I'm insane for what I tolerate, but the one thing I know for certain, we're all underpaid!
