#### COURSE PROFILE:

Brookside Country Club was founded in 1916 and was originally a 9 hole course. It was expanded to 18 holes in 1956. An automatic irrigation system was installed in 1990. Brookside Country Club is a private club with 325 members, 180 of which are golfers and 145 are social. The average 18 hole round is played in under 3-1/2 hours.

### DIRECTIONS TO BROOKSIDE COUNTRY CLUB

Prospect & Adams Street Pottstown, PA 19464 (215) 326-7069

<u>Take Pennsylvania Turnpike</u> East to Morgantown Exit. Turn left at end of ramp to Route 23. Turn left onto Route 23 East. Follow Route 23 to Route 100 North (left hand turn). Follow Route 100 North to State Street —turn right. (This will be the fourth traffic light). Go to first traffic light and turn left onto Wilson Street. Follow Wilson Street to fourth traffic light. Turn left onto Adams Street. Club entrance is 500 yards on right side.

From King of Prussia Area: From Route 202 take Route 422 West (Pass all exits for Oaks, Collegeville, Royersford, Limerick and Sanatoga). Take Armand Hammer Exit (hospital exit). Off exit ramp, turn right. Go through first light. At second light (High Street - Hospital on right) cross over High Street to Wilson Street. Veer right. Continue until third stop sign. Turn left on North Keim Street. One block later at stop sign, turn right onto Jackson Street. The Golf Course is on the right side. Go down the hill to the light and turn right onto North Adams Street. The Club entrance is the first road on the right.

\* Do not use the Service Entrance on Jackson Street — you will have to turn back.

<u>From South</u>: Take Route 100 North to Route 422 Junction. Go East on 422 to the Armand Hammer Exit. Proceed as above.

From East: Take Route 422 West to Armond Hammer Exit and proceed as above.

### AUSTIN BECKONS GCSAA COMPETITORS

Austin, Texas, is ready to serve as host city for the 1994 GCSAA Golf Championship, to be held

Jan. 31- Feb. 1.

Located near the geographic center of the state, Austin is situated on the eastern edge of the Hill Country, a 32,000-square-mile area of limestone hills forested with oak, cedar, and mesquite.

An abundance of lakes and naturally fed springs dot the area, creating a pleasant surprise for first-time visitors who envision Texas as flat,

dry and dusty.

Headquarters Hotel

The Hyatt Regency Austin on Town Lake, the tournament headquarters hotel, has extended a special \$72 room rate to tournament participants. Tournament registration and all tournament functions will be held at the Hyatt Regency.

Overlooking the scenic Colorado River/ Town Lake in downtown Austin, the hotel is convenient to numerous area attractions — including the famous Sixth Street entertainment district. Sixth Street's bars, restaurants and nightclubs feature some of the best live entertainment found anywhere.

#### The Golf Courses

As for the golf, the area's geography has allowed for the creation of a large and varied collection of outstanding golf courses. The four courses selected for the 1994 tournament magnificently capture the natural beauty of the land—and provide an honest test of your game.

First on the list is Austin Country Club, a spectacular Pete Dye layout that stretches to 6,822 yards and features two contrasting styles.

A portion of the front nine is reminiscent of a links style course, with tall native grasses and gently rolling terrain. Three holes border the Colorado River.

The rest of the course was routed through the heavily wooded hillsides, placing a premium on accuracy and club selection.

Bill Hanna is superintendent at Austin Coun-

try Club.

(Note: Austin CC is the home of Harvey Penick, the legendary golf teacher whose recent instruction book, *Harvey Penick's Little Red Book*, has become a best seller. Penick's son Tinsley has succeeded him as head professional, although

the elder Penick can frequently be seen giving

instruction on the driving range.)

Our second course is located at Barton Creek Conference Resort and Country Club. GCSAA competitors will play one of the two Barton Creek Courses, the Crenshaw/Coore course.

The design team of Ben Crenshaw and Bill Coore let the natural elevation changes and rolling terrain provide the challenge—and plenty of

it—on this layout.

Besides providing dramatic scenery, the course is also refreshingly strategic in nature. There is nothing artificial about this course.

Dale Miller was recently named head superintendent at Barton Creek, replacing Tim Long, who has accepted another position with the company.

The third course in the 1994 lineup is Circle C Golf Club, designed by noted architect Jay Mor-

rish.

The course, which opened in 1992, is routed through a heavy thicket of native oak and cedar trees, placing a premium on shot placement. This is particularly important is setting up approach shots to the large, well-protected greens.

Although Circle C doesn't feature elevation changes as drastic as some area courses, it is rapidly earning respect for its challenge and

design.

Matt Linscott is superintendent at Circle C. The final host course for the 1994 Champion-

ships is The Hills of Lakeway.

The course was designed by Jack Nicklaus, who was heard to say on his first visit to the site that it was "one of the finest pieces of natural land on which to build a golf course that I have ever seen." He did not disappoint.

Nine-thousand-year-old Hurst Creek meanders through the heavily wooded and rolling

terrain, coming into play on 13 holes.

The result is some of the most beautiful and

challenging golf to be found anywhere.

Greg Hinton is superintendent at the Hills of Lakeway.


