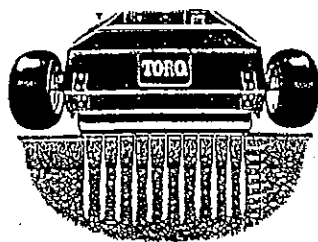



WHAT IS SUCCESS? from The Bonnie Greensward (PAGCS)

How you perceive success can affect you well being.

If you see it as making lots of money, or gaining recognition, or striving only for results, you may be setting yourself up for a fall.

Why? Your basing your well being on external rewards that you may be unable to control. When they fail you, you'll suffer.

Even if you gain these rewards, you might reach a point where you'll begin to question your achievements.

Consider this: Despite his tremendous accomplishments, a very successful executive got out of bed one morning and shuddered at the prospect of going to work. He said he felt little gratification from his many achievements and asked himself, "Is that all there is?"

Consider these suggestions: Let your internal guidance system tell you what is really important to you. Ask yourself such questions as: If I had six months to live, what would my priorities be? And, If I could write my own obituary, what would I want it to say?

* **Emphasize** how your work contributes to the greater good. For example, if you were to sell a product or an idea, visualize how that item or idea can benefit those who use it.

* **Take pride** in how well you do your job. Strive for excellence. Lean back from time to time to enjoy what you have accomplished.

* **Find rewards** in the process of doing your job. Don't be over concerned about results. Enjoy the moment-to-moment absorption in the activity. When you truly focus on process, you begin to relish the quality of the experience.

* **Avoid** depending on others to tell you how you're doing. Develop an internal set of standards to guide you. When you look to others for approval, you grant them enormous power over you. Caution: Never close your mind to suggestions from others or you'll become rigid.

* **See yourself** as a problem solver. If not, you'll be constantly setting yourself up for failure whenever a roadblock appears.

Don't be afraid to fail. Consider this question: "What one great thing would you do if you knew you could not fail?"

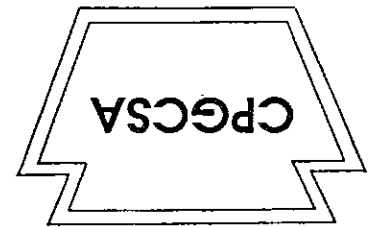

BALLAD TO A GOLF COURSE.....

"A golf course is a pretty thing. It needs a lot of care.
It's hard to keep it lookin' good with all that wear and tear.
Mow the greens, and fairways too; It's an all day job.
Water, spray and aerify; and then wait for the mob.
