Getting Organized: How to Schedule Your Day

If your workload keeps growing as fast as your workday seems to shrink, maybe your problem is a lack of organization.





#### PAUL HARVEY WRONG AGAIN

Radio personality Paul Harvey took another swing at the golf course superintendent's profession with his Feb. 9 "news".

The past two years, Harvey has tried to blame pesticide use for ridding the country's golf courses of bird song. Then, superintendents were shocked to hear Harvey's claim that "regulation of the use of those chemicals is almost non existent."

This time, he has twisted the findings of University of Iowa mortality study of GCSAA members, commissioned by GCSAA Scholarship & Research.

Dr. Burton Kross, the University of Iowa's lead investigator on the project, wrote Harvey, "Your commentary is inaccurate and misleading with respect to our study. Our study did not collect any data about pesticides and birds. Moreover, as clearly stated in our press release (copy enclosed), our statistical mortality study was not capable of supporting or refuting a cause-and-effect relationship between pesticides and cancer. Indeed, my recommendations about smoking cessation and minimizing pesticide exposures are prudent public health strategies for golf course superintendents and the general public."


