

Do You Have A Low Sperm Count? from TURFCOMMS

What fungicides have you been using lately? A July 2, 1994, pg. 15, Science News report on a scientific article published in Toxicology and Applied Pharmacology points to long term use of **vinclozolin** as a possible cause. Vinclozolin is the common chemical name for the active ingredient in Curalan, Vorlan, or Touche' fungicides. It is a close relative of iprodione (26019). The breakdown products of vinclozolin are 10 to 100 times more effective at blocking androgen receptors in reproductive tissue than the fungicide itself.

The researchers exposed pregnant rats to 200 milligrams of vinclozolin per kilogram of body weight. The effect on male offspring was a frightening feminization. They are not sure what lower rates will do but there is reason to believe the results won't be what you want, so be careful and make your workers wear that protective clothing.





LEARN ROCKY'S ROAD TO SUCCESS

Rocky Bleier, legendary running back for the Pittsburgh Steelers, will kick off GCSAA's 66th International Golf Course Conference and Show. Bleier's keynote address will be part of the Opening Session, scheduled at 5:30 PM Thursday, February 23, at the San Francisco Marriott.

After being drafted by the Steelers in 1968, Bleier was drafted again — this time, for combat duty in Vietnam. Shortly thereafter, both of his legs were wounded by enemy fire. He could barely walk and certainly couldn't run. To ever play professional football again seemed impossible.

But Bleier did just that, after an agonizing two-year battle to overcome his injuries. His courageous comeback to the Steelers is described in the book, "Fighting Back," and was recreated in the 1980 ABC-TV movie of the same title. Bleier's perseverance paid off in an exciting 12-year career, in which he contributed to four Super Bowl victories.


