## Mid-Atlantic USGA Update

## What Happened To Spring?

The calendar says that spring arrives on March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2004. The snow on the ground at both our West Chester and Pittsburgh offices suggests otherwise! The optimism sparked by some warm weather a few weeks ago is tempered by the realization that we have been in a period of weather extremes and this pattern obviously continues.

The first examples of winter damage have been confirmed. That's the bad news. The good news is that most of the damage is confined to areas where winter injury can be expected, that is, areas that accumulate water and ice and have poor surface drainage. Also, this type of injury seems to be worse on shaded/pocketed greens that also tend to have higher populations of *Poa annua*.

On most other turf areas, while the grass may look discolored it seems to be exhibiting only superficial damage. We just need some good growing weather for the grass to green-up and begin its spring growth.

To help this process along, don't forget light spring fertilization. Extra fertilizer can help the grass grow out of its winter discoloration that is due to desiccation. This is a type of freezedrying. Also, most grasses develop their root systems in the spring.

Also, research indicates a link between fertility and fungicide effectiveness. That is, fungicides simply work better in the presence of some nitrogen fertilization. The grass may need some extra fertilizer, but, as always, do not over-fertilize the turf. While we mention nitrogen, balanced fertility is always important. Remember the basics, the grass needs nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium in the traditional 3-1-2 or 4-1-2 ratios.

## **Directions to Wedgewood Golf Course**

From Harrisburg

From Route 78 use Exit 60 from Harrisburg to Route 309 South (Quakertown). Travel approximately a quarter mile and bear right to Saucon Valley Road West. Make a right at the light onto Saucon Valley Road West. At the second stop sign make a left onto Limeport Pike. Drive approximately a quarter mile and turn right into our parking lot.

From New Jersey

From Route 78 use Exit 60A to Route 309 South (Quakertown). Travel approximately a quarter mile and bear right to Saucon Valley Road West. Make a right at the light onto Saucon Valley Road West. At the second stop sign make a left onto Limeport Pike. Drive approximately a quarter mile and turn right into our parking lot.

From Philadelphia:

From the Northeast Extension of the PA Turnpike take Exit 32 for Quakertown. After the toll, make a left onto 663 North. Continue to the intersection of Route 309. At the light, make a left onto Route 309 North. Travel approximately 11 miles to the intersection of Saucon Valley Road. There is no left turn at that intersection so travel past the light and bear right to take the jug-handle around to the light. Stay on Saucon Valley Road West until you are at the second stop sign. Make a left onto Limeport Pike. Drive approximately a quarter mile and turn right into our parking lot.

## **Penn State Conducting Survey** of Putting Green Conditions in Pennsylvania

Penn State has initiated a survey of putting green conditions in Pennsylvania. The objective of the survey is to evaluate putting green characteristics, such as green speed, surface hardness, thatch depth, etc., and other non-agronomic factors like operating budget and determine which factors are strongly correlated with one another. Over 70 golf courses will participate in the study, which represents about 10% of the total golf courses in the state. The survey will be concluded in the fall of 2004 and results will be published in early 2005. The results will help golf course superintendents and golfers better understand the what conditions are required in order to maintain fast green speeds and how their golf courses compare to golf courses within the same economic status.

The study is being funded by the Pennsylvania Turfgrass Council, Greater Pittsburgh Golf Course Superintendents Assoc., Mountain and Valley Golf Course Superintendents Assoc., and the Philadelphia Assoc. of Golf Course Superintendents. 
## Mechanic's Tip

Skip Owen, Equipment Manager at the Carlisle Country Club has volunteered this month's tip.

Problem: The original skid bar on the ends of the National Mower units were causing unacceptable turf damage under certain conditions. (Photo 1)

Solution: Skip has replaced the skid bar with a 5" round common mower deck wheel. (Photo 2) He then welded a 5 ½" x 3/8" triangular plate in place of the skid bar. Finally, he drilled a ½" hole to mount the deck wheel so it is set about ¼" high.





- A guest is limited to two (2) meetings per year with the exception of club officials or with Board approval.



## Sick and Tired!!!

This past meeting held at Heritage Hills Golf Resort, we shared the knowledge of Mr. Robert Hubbard from "Geeseaway". The title of Bob's presentation was: "Sick and Tired of Being Sick and Tired?"
