Golf Course Profile

Since Opening in 1993, Quail Valley has been a favorite choice for locals and visiting golfers, alike. The Course was recently purchased by Scott and Colyn Keller, grandsons of the late Yankee great, Charlie Keller. Quail Valley offers an outstanding challenge with two distinctly different nines.

The front plays through mature stand of trees. The back is more open with water lurking on seven of the nine holes. Five sets of tees guarantee golfers of all abilities the opportunity to take advantage of demanding risk/reward par 5's, a beautiful signature par 3, and the courses trademark fast greens. Golfers will find all the holes at Quail Valley to be enjoyable and imaginative, the stakes are raised the highest at No. 13, the layouts signature par 3 island green. The tee shot provides a psychological challenge for golfers of all abilities. Playing roughly 150 yards, the green is actually a lot larger than it appears from the tee box. Bunkers to the left and right will collect shots hit a little off line and there is more room up front than you might think. Still, any shot that lands on the island green is reason for celebration.

Quail Valley does a great job of mixing in both short and long holes, your final score will depend a lot on how well you position yourself on the tee. Most of the greens are small and well bunkered, thus demanding pinpoint approach shots.

New Handbook Will Help Make Golf Courses More "Green"

Golf Course Superintendents can now take advantage of a new Water Resources Best Management Practices Handbook to help make their courses truly green.

The Pennsylvania Environmental Council (PEC), in partnership with LandStudies, Inc., published the new Best Management Practices Handbook with financial assistance from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's Growing Greener Grant Program.

"Pennsylvania has over 800 public and private golf courses covering thousands of acres of open space, streams and ponds" said Don Welsh, President & CEO Pennsylvania Environmental Council. "With this Handbook, superintendents can improve water quality and watershed habitat at their courses using proven best management practices that in many cases will also lower maintenance costs."

The Handbook includes a detailed description of each recommended Practice, its environmental benefit, and a local example with contact information so that superintendents can learn first-hand how to install the Practice. The Handbook also includes hyperlinks to additional online resources for each

PEC and LandStudies were assisted by John Chassard, Director of Grounds at Lehigh Country Club, and Jeff Broadbelt, President, Agrostis Golf Management. Mr. Chassard and Mr. Broadbelt and LandStudies collected information about state of the art Practices from golf course superintendents across the Commonwealth as part of the development of the Handbook.

The Handbook provides information about how the Practices, such as created or restored wetlands and natural floodplains, can generate additional value environmental service credits; including nutrient reduction, wetland mitigation and habitat credits.

The Handbook also includes techniques for capturing and mitigating storm water runoff and increasing groundwater recharge at golf courses. These storm water management practices can be integrated with local watershed management strategies in cooperation with local municipalities.



Rather than playing a round, he's patrolling the course, ridding Saucon's 800 acres of the perennial pest, the goose. Adopted by Gabe Wochley, Saucon's Grace Course Superintendent, Max represents his German Shorthaired Pointer (GSP) breed well. He was quick to learn his new job, desires to please and at the end of the day nothing makes him happier than settling in with his new owner.

Surrendered to German Shorthaired Pointer Rescue PA by his former owner, who was to be deployed, Max's journey to his new home started when Gabe submitted an application through the GSP Rescue PA website. When asked why he chose a GSP and a rescue, Gabe said, "Having had a Weimaraner as a child, I knew the pointer breed was high energy and loved the outdoors and there are so many dogs in rescue that need

a home. So, I decided to give finding a rescue with the right fit a chance."

Deb Orpen, one of the founding volunteers of GSP Rescue PA (active since the mid-1990s) is committed to pairing dogs and owners. "Volunteers, particularly those who foster, work very hard to assess each GSP and home in order to make placements that offer a good fit for the dog and their new family." Another active GSP volunteer, Jessi Wyke believes GSPs and golf courses are made for each other, "GSPs have high prey drive but are able to be called off easily. They would consider chasing geese great fun."

Ron Burda of Vogel Hund Kennels and Training Academy who noted, "Training GSPs for goose chasing is like training a flushing breed without the need to retrieve. The GSP is a great fit for this job. I hope to see more golf courses using them."

Friendly and focused, he draws the attention of Saucon's members who, as one member observed, may wish to be reincarnated as the next Max, spending their day on the course.
