## **Directions to Lehigh Country Club**

2319 S. Cedar Crest Boulevard Allentown, PA 18103

#### FROM HARRISBURG

Stay on 78 East to the Cedar Crest Boulevard Exit. Bear right off the ramp. Lehigh Valley Hospital will be on your right. Go through two traffic lights. After the second light, go about 7/10 of a mile. Lehigh Country Club is on the left-hand side. Look for white brick pillars with LCC on them, just before the third traffic light.

#### FROM PHILADELPHIA

Take the Northeast extension (route 476) of the PA Turnpike to the Lehigh Valley exit. After the toll booth (keep right) and follow signs for Allentown. You are now on Route 22 East for about 1/4 mile. Take the 309 South exit. After one exit, Route 309 South will merge into Interstate 78 East. Go to the second exit, Cedar Crest Boulevard, and bear right off the ramp. Lehigh Valley Hospital will be on your right. Go through two traffic lights. After the second light go about 7/10 of a mile. Lehigh Country Club is on the left-hand side. Look for white brick pillars with LCC on them, just before the third light.

INTERSTATE 78 From Hellertown, Easton, New Jersey

Stay on 78 West to Cedar Crest Boulevard exit. Turn left onto Cedar Crest Boulevard. Lehigh Valley Hospital will be on your right. Go through three traffic lights. After the third light, go about 7/10 of a mile. Lehigh Country Club is on the left-hand side. Look for white brick pillars with LCC on them, just before the fourth light.

## Golf Course Profile - Lehigh Country Club

Lehigh CC was designed by Master Golf Architect William Flynn back in 1927 and is one of the most beautiful and natural parkland courses in the world. Situated along the Little Lehigh (stream) in the rolling hills of the Lehigh Valley in Pennsylvania, the course follows a routing that is pure Flynn genius. Eminently walkable, Lehigh features some very dramatic topography and changes of elevation of 105 feet from the lowest point on the golf course to the highest. The design has a collection of some of the best greensites Flynn ever conceived. With three sets of tees ranging from 5500 to 6600 yards and playing to a par 70, Lehigh offers plenty of challenge and enjoyment to all levels of golfers.

There is not an indifferent hole on the course and each one presents its own unique challenges. As we all know, Flynn believed the ground game was integral to a great golf course and Lehigh is no exception. All but three of the greens are often best attacked using the contours of the approaches.

The set of four par threes is second to none ranging in length from 177 yards to 226 yards from the back tees. Each is different and all are difficult but great fun to play. Lehigh's two par fives are two of the best holes on the course. Both offer risk reward options and tempt the bold golfer to reach the green in two. The 11th is the more dramatic of the two with an 80 foot drop from an elevated fairway to the tiny green below tucked just beyond the Lehigh stream. The par fours offer great variety in shot options and design. The shortish ones in particular, are all a thrill to play and loaded with character.

Huge specimen trees frame holes and fairways but rarely interfere with well-struck golf shots. It's hard to find a much better walk anywhere! Sling your clubs over your shoulder or take a caddy and Lehigh is as good as parkland golf gets.



## Happy 75th Anniversary CPGCSA!!!!

On Tuesday evening April 11, 1939 a meeting was held at the Colonial Country Club in Harrisburg for the purpose of organizing the greenskeepers of the area. Those in attendance at this meeting were George Morris, Riley Heckert, Hugh McJunis, James Morrison, Charles Bolton, John Grove, Jack Narril, and Al Heron. At this meeting it was decided to call the group "The Central Pennsylvania Greenskeepers Association". Officers elected were George Morris - President, Hugh McJunis - Vice President, and Riley Heckert - Secretary-Treasurer. Meetings were scheduled for the second Monday of each month with monthly meetings March through November. Dues to cover expenses were set at \$3.00 and the first meeting was set for May 8, 1939 at the Colonial Country Club.

Riley Heckert sent letters to all greenskeepers in the area to announce the gathering. The day started with golf in the afternoon and was followed by dinner. Following dinner Mr. Musser and Mr. Benham from State College and County Agent Fromeyer spoke about fairway grasses, heights of cut for bluegrass and fertilization. Following the educational sessions a business meeting was held and Edward Zwick and E. P. Morris were taken into the Association as new members, raising the membership to ten.

During 1939 the membership grew to thirteen members and at the November meeting the members decided that they wanted to continue meeting throughout the winter rather that wait until March as originally planned.

The Association was a success, just as today, 75 years later.
