2014 Rafferty DSL Recipient Faron J. Stoops

Faron was born, raised and still resides in Waynesboro, PA. He graduated from Waynesboro Area High School, where he played on the golf team. Faron began playing golf at Waynesboro Municipal GC at the age of 5 with his Dad.

After graduation, he worked at Waynesboro Municipal Golf Course under Harry Grove III for 3 years before he applied to the Winter Turfgrass Management program at The Pennsylvania State University. Upon graduation from The Pennsylvania State University with Highest Distinction, he began his career at Chambersburg Country Club under David Rafferty. After serving as Assistant Superintendent for 5 years, he was promoted to Golf Course Superintendent. Faron was Superintendent for 3 years before the Club decided to move in a different direction. He worked in lawn care for 2 years before he secured another position in the golf course industry. Mt View Golf Course, in Fairfield, PA gave him the next opportunity. Waynesboro Country Club, his hometown Club, hired him to replace their long time Superintendent of 51 years; weeks after his departure from Mt View GC. Faron is currently in his 13th year there as Superintendent.

From the Archives....

Revised Rules of Golf

One: On beginning play, as many balls as may be required to obtain a satisfactory result may be played from the first tee. Everyone recognizes a good player needs to "loosen up" but does not have time for the practice tee.

Two: A ball sliced or hooked into the rough shall be lifted and placed in the fairway at a point equal to the distance it carried or rolled in the rough. Such veering right or left frequently results from friction between the face of the club and the cover of the ball, and the player should not be penalized for erratic behavior of the ball resulting from such uncontrollable mechanical phenomena.

Three: A ball hitting a tree shall be deemed not to have hit the tree. Hitting a tree is simply bad luck and has no place in a scientific game. The player should estimate the distance the ball would have traveled if it has not hit the tree and play the ball from there, preferable for atop a nice firm tuft of grass.

Four: There shall be no such thing as a lost ball. The missing ball is on or near the course and eventually be found and pocketed by someone else. It thus becomes a stolen ball, and the player should not compound the felony by charging himself with a penalty stroke.

Five: When played from a sand trap, a ball which does not clear the lip on being struck may be hit again on the roll without counting an extra stroke. In no case will more than two strokes be counted in playing from a trap, since it is only reasonable to assume that if a player had time to concentrate on his shot, instead of hurrying it so as not to delay his playing partners, he would be out in two.

Six: If a putt passes over the hole without dropping, it is deemed to have dropped. The law of gravity holds that any object attempting to maintain a position in the atmosphere without something to support it must drop. The law of gravity supersedes the law of golf.

Seven: Same thing goes for a ball that stops at the brink of the hole and hangs there, defying gravity. You cannot defy gravity.

Eight: Same thing goes for a ball that rims a cup. A ball should not go sideways. This violates the law of physics.

Nine: A putt that stops close enough to the cup to inspire such comments as "you could blow it in" may be blown in. This rule does not apply if the ball is more than three inches away from the hole, because no one wants to make a travesty of the game.

From Rt 30

Turn onto Susquehanna Trail (across from McDonalds) At 3rd signal light turn left onto Stillmeadow Lane. Proceed to traffic signal intersection - go straight through intersection -Proceed 4th street on the left which is Detwiler Dr., - follow Detwiler past stop sign - club is on your right.

From North: I - 83 South to Exit 22

Turn right at bottom of exit onto Lightner Rd. by Rutter's Dairy to the next signal light - turn right on Susquehanna Trail - follow to the next signal light and take a left onto Stillmeadow Lane - proceed to traffic signal intersection - go straight through intersection - proceed to 4th street on the left which is Detwiler Dr. - follow Detwiler past stop sign - club is on your right.

From South: I - 83 North to Exit 22

Take first left before bottom of exit to stop sign. Turn left onto N. George St. to signal light - at light take a right onto Lightner Rd. by Rutter's Dairy to the next signal - turn right on Susquehanna Trail - follow to the next signal light and take a left onto Stillmeadow Lane - proceed to traffic signal intersection - go straight through intersection - proceed to 4th street on the left which is Detwiler Dr. - follow Detwiler past stop sign - club is on your right.
