Another Arrow In the Quiver to Fight WOTUS

Since the Clean Water Rule (commonly known as "WOTUS") was first proposed, the GCSAA has argued its implementation will lead to uncertainty for golf course superintendents as they try to decide whether activities previously conducted on, over, or near the surface waters at their courses will now require a permit under an expanded scope of the federal Clean Water Act.

As noted previously, the <u>WOTUS rule has been temporarily stayed by the US.</u>

<u>Court of Appeals for the 6th Circuit</u>. As we await a final decision on the rule's merits, the U.S. Supreme Court in an 8-0 decision issued May 31, 2016 ruled that landowners can challenge in court the wetlands determinations made by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and EPA. The Court has provided another limit on the federal government's involvement in decisions impacting the waters on their land: the right to sue a determination made by the Corps or EPA that a water body is a "water of the U.S." under the Clean Water Act.

This "jurisdictional determination" is the first step to involving the federal government in land use decisions impacting water, including those that would be covered under WOTUS. The right to sue such a determination gives golf another "arrow in the quiver" regardless of whether or not the WOTUS rule is allowed to become final.

Section 404 of the Clean Water Act regulates the discharge of dredged or fill materials into "waters of the United States", including wetlands. Before allowing such an activity on a parcel of land, the Corps needs to first issue a jurisdictional determination over the water. The question the Supreme Court considered in U.S. Army Corps of Engineers v. Hawkes was whether a jurisdictional determination could be subject to judicial review under the federal Administrative Procedures Act, in effect involving the courts in the process before any further activity was undertaken on the land or permits were sought. The Supreme Court found that jurisdictional determination was subject to judicial review, because of the finality of the decision (including legal consequences) and the lack of adequate alternatives.

This is a significant step toward limiting agencies' control under the Clean Water Act. It also provides insight into how the U.S. Supreme Court might eventually review the WOTUS rule, should it get the chance. Therefore, it is a positive development in the fight over the expansion of the WOTUS definition. The GCSAA will continue this fight.

Rule Expands Overtime Pay To Millions

A new rule will make anyone earning less than \$47,476 automatically eligible for overtime pay when working more than 40 hours a week. The White House announced the change on May 18, but the rule won't go into effect until Dec. 1, 2016. The amount nearly doubles the previous threshold, which was \$23,660. The number of workers eligible for overtime had dropped drastically from 62 percent in 1975 to the current 7 percent. Under the new rule, 35 percent of salaried workers would be eligible, and the threshold will be updated every three years to make sure it stays in the 40th percentile of the lowest income region in the country. The Department of Labor estimates the change will result in an additional \$12 billion in pay for workers over the next decade.


